

# 47 Current And Former Ohio State Student-Athletes Receive Degrees



Ohio State held the university's summer commencement ceremony on Sunday at the Schottenstein Center, and 47 current and former Ohio State student-athletes received their degrees.

Among the graduates are national champions like Adelaide Aquialla in track and field and several members of the Ohio State women's hockey team that won the program's first national title in 2022, as well as Olympians such as Emily Armstrong, who competed on the Canadian artistic swimming team at the 2020 Tokyo Games.

Also among the graduates are seven current and former football players, including safety Josh Proctor and tight end Gee Scott Jr.
