

BSB Reprints: Manning Topped Buckeyes In Citrus Bowl

He had his chance to face Ohio State on Jan. 1, 1996, in the Citrus Bowl. The Buckeyes led, 7-0, early, but Manning led his team to a 20-14 victory.

It was a pedestrian day from the future NFL quarterback, who completed 20 of 35 passes for 182 yards with one touchdown. Ohio State's Bobby Hoying was 19 for 38 for 246 yards with a touchdown and an interception.

Also included in these reprints is a story about defensive coordinator Bill Young, who left John Cooper's staff for Oklahoma. Early this year, Ohio State co-defensive coordinator Alex Grinch left to join the Sooners as well.
