Fifth-year senior wide receiver Parris Campbell, a key leader and of the Ohio State's team captains, can be seen getting his teammates ready for practice early in the clip.

The video features, among other things, clips of running backs J.K. Dobbins and Mike Weber going through drills, defensive end Nick Bosa exploding off the block and highlight-reel plays by freshman cornerback Tyreke Johnson and sophomore wide receiver Binjimen Victor.
