

Highlights: Ohio State Blows Out Michigan, Finishes Undefeated Regular Season

Ohio State entered Michigan Stadium on Saturday with an undefeated regular season, and likely a College Football Playoff bid on the line. The top ranked Buckeyes had already secured a Big Ten championship game berth, but as any member of Ohio State would be quick to say, there's no such thing as overlooking a battle with Michigan.

Despite a slow start, the Buckeyes showed off the importance of that focus, ripping through the Wolverines on the way to a dominant 56-27 win in Ann Arbor.

While Michigan struck first to take a 6-0 lead, Ohio State had a quick response, off of two big J.K. Dobbins runs.

After the teams exchanged punts, the Buckeyes struck again, on a massive pass from Justin Fields to the star of the 2018 rendition of The Game, Chris Olave.

Another Michigan score cut the deficit to one, but Ohio State leaned on Dobbins again to jump back to an eight point lead.
